- For the internship (PUBH 4V80), students must have senior status, completed 24 PUBH credits, attend mandatory internship meeting, and have public health director permission.
 - Students who wish to change their major to Public Health after completing coursework at Baylor must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above.
 - A cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above is required for retention in the major and to qualify for graduation.
 - Students planning to matriculate into 5-year MPH program are required to have a 3.2 GPA and meet other requirements to qualify.
